Services

- Welcome program for new residents
- Residential care for older people whose care needs range from low or minimal up to high levels of support
- Support for people with dementia and cognitive impairment
- 24-hour professional nursing and personal care
- Cleaning and general laundry service
- Meals and refreshments
- Assistance with daily living activities
- Emotional support, pastoral care and chaplaincy
- Treatments and procedures, rehabilitation support and assistance in obtaining health practitioner services.

Room types and features

Uniting Wontama offers a range of room types.

- Rooms are bright and airy with plenty of natural light
- Each room offers home comforts including a king single bed, bedside table, built in wardrobe heating and cooling system
- Bathrooms are equipped with handrails and an emergency call system
- Rooms are designed for privacy while promoting community living through easy access to common areas
- Dementia friendly households are available.

Common areas

- The main common/lounge room is air-conditioned and offers a place for residents and their families to gather informally and enjoy use of the large modern TV, DVD player, library service and comfortable seating
- When privacy is required for family gatherings or quiet discussions, there are small, peaceful lounge areas, and dining rooms allow residents and guests to enjoy meals in comfortable surroundings
- Child-friendly outdoor sitting areas with landscaped gardens for residents, family and friends to enjoy
- Activity room with state of the art audio visual equipment
- Multi-denominational chapel with sacred space
- Café with indoor and outdoor seating
- Private meeting rooms for family and staff.
